Summerset Residents... This Is A Call For Service!!!

Now is the time to get involved!

We are looking for residents interested in serving their community.

Why should you serve?

Residents get involved for many reasons: some get involved to make change, some may get involved to maintain what is already in place; some to enhance what is currently built, while others seek involvement as a way to start a political career.

For whatever reason someone gets involved it's about community! Remember even if you like things the way they currently are it takes someone serving to make that happen!

Our city is small and we have a small work force but our employees are excellent at what they do!
Our elected officials won't simply attend two commission meetings every month; our elected officials are indirect elements of our work force.

Commissioners receive a \$6,600 stipend annually, this includes a \$600 phone stipend.

What type of work can you expect as a commissioner?

You will need to attend meetings with contractors, engineers, state and local governments, constituents and many other organizations; some of these meetings may occur during the work day, however it does seem to work out for the most part for the commissioners to meet at the end of the work day with their perspective department. These business hour meetings, are in-frequent, however, when a project calls or a constituent needs to meet they occur more commonly until things get off the ground or are resolved.

How Much Time Do I Need to Give?

The two commission seats that are available are for a 3 year term. Petition circulation started January 27th and will end February 24th.

This is an exciting time for our city. Remember, it takes all of us to commit and give a little of ourselves so that our families will continue to have a great place to call home.



How Do I Get Involved?

If you are interested in a position, please feel free to contact our Finance Office to learn about the election process. Petitions may be filed with the Finance Office located at Summerset City Hall, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Mountain Standard Time.

The last day to file a petition for either position is February 24, 2017 at 5:00pm. We will welcome any questions and look forward to your interest to serve.



Planning and Development Update:

Ordinance Revisions and Manual Adoptions

Summerset's Board of Commissioners approved Planning and Zoning Commission's recommendations for minor revisions to the following ordinances and the adoption of two new Summerset manuals. Engineering has reviewed the changes, legal will be presenting their recommendations February 2nd. The first reading on the ordinances is expected on February 2nd as well. Adoption of the manuals could be approved at the meeting as well. The following ordinances have been revised and the following two manuals are being considered

- Ordinance #115 Subdivision Ordinance
- Ordinance #2 Zoning Ordinance
- Ordinance #1 General Municipal Code
- Ordinance #22 Traffic
- Ordinance #18 Snow Removal
- Summerset Infrastructure Design Criteria Manual-2017 Edition
- Summerset Stormwater Manual-2017 Edition

Once we have updated and adopted the above ordinances Summerset is planning on contracting with either American Legal Publishing or Municode to codify all current ordinances. This review will take place during the year of 2017. This is being done to review all ordinances for inconsistencies and review current code to ensure it is in compliance with current state statute.


Fox Den Storage-12192 Sioux Land Road

How to Make a Winter Survival Kit

Everyone should carry a Winter Survival Kit in their car. In an emergency, it could save your life and the lives of your passengers. Here is what you need:

- a shovel
- windshield scraper and small broom
- flashlight with extra batteries
- battery powered radio
- water
- snack food including energy bars
- raisins and mini candy bars
- matches and small candles
- extra hats, socks and mittens
- First aid kit with pocket knife
- Necessary medications
- blankets or sleeping bag
- tow chain or rope
- road salt, sand, or cat litter for traction
- booster cables
- emergency flares and reflectors
- fluorescent distress flag and whistle to attract attention
- Cell phone adapter to plug into lighter
