#### **City News**

The City is pleased to announce that, over the past few months, Semmler Construction has been working on the new Public Works shop building. This building will be used for the storage and maintenance of all the City's Public Works equipment.

# Street Smarts

The Public Works department is currently working on assembling a list of areas in need of repairs for the City's annual street maintenance projects. This years projects will consist of addressing asphalt areas that are in need and repairing Sanitary Sewer manholes that are not level with the road. These areas could potentially cause damage to the City's snowplowing equipment.



# Squash Iti

Every year the City treats mosquito prone areas to help control the spread of the West Nile virus. Briquettes are placed in areas with standing water. These are long lasting (up to 60 days). Grass areas around the City that are surrounded by water are then sprayed with a chemical to help reduce and alleviate the repopulation of mosquitos thus reducing the spread of West Nile in our community.

#### A Friendly Reminder on Fireworks...

#### City of Summerset Code of Ordinance


#### 96.12 FIREWORKS DISPLAY.

- (A) It shall be unlawful for any discharge or cause to be discharged, except as hereinafter permitted, any fireworks.
- (B) The use of certain novelty fireworks within the city are permitted and are limited to the following:
  - (1) Party poppers (not to exceed 0.25 grain);
  - (2) Snappers (not to exceed 0.02 grain);
  - (3) Sparklers (not to exceed 3.5 ounces);
  - (4) Toy caps (not to exceed 0.25 grain); and
  - (5) Flitter sparklers (not to exceed 0.2 ounces).
- (C) Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit a public display and discharge of fireworks, providing such licensed individual, firm, partnership or corporation planning to make a public display and discharge of fireworks, shall first secure a written permit from the city and Chief of the Fire Department upon which jurisdiction falls.
- (D) This chapter extends to and shall cover all of the territory within the corporate limits of the city and its one-mile jurisdiction.

#### Fireworks safety tips:

- -Light only one firework at a time, at arm's length, with an extended lighter
- -After lighting fireworks, immediately back up to a safe distance
- -Always wear eye protection/safety glasses when lighting fireworks
- -Wear gloves when using sparklers(leather preferred) as they can be hot as a blow torch & over 15 times hotter than boiling water
- -Never aim or throw fireworks @ another person, animal or building
- -Properly dispose of all fireworks-allow used fireworks to soak in water for a few hours before discarding
- -Never attempt to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks
- -Have a bucket of water or working garden hose accessible
- Never carry a firework in your pocket or shoot them from a metal or glass container
- Anyone handling fireworks under the age of 18, should have parental/adult supervison
